New Permits:

You must be either a life member or a paid-up club member for 6 months or more before you can apply for a new permit and you must include \$20 in cash or cheque, payable to the MMCCV.

When applying for a Permit for a...

<u>Morris Minor</u>. Please Send a <u>Current RWC</u>, with Proof of ownership, VicRoads Club Permit application, Vehicle eligibility and standard declaration for club permit vehicle.

<u>Non-Morris Minor</u>. The request must be accompanied by all of the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor, held in the name of the applicant.

In addition to the above, 6 recent photos 1: Front, 2: Rear, 3: Driver's side, 4: Driving position (side-on with driver's door open), 5: Chassis number or ID plate, 6: Engine Bay.

You must clearly sign and date the rear side of each of the 6 photos.

Renewals:

Do not forget to sign your renewal application. If not signed it will be returned to you and so waste valuable time and postage.

Club permit holders Club fees are due by the end of March if not paid by you your car will become unlawful 4 red plates and Vic Road will be notified that you are no longer a member of the car club there is no cooling off period it must be done before the end of March thank you Wayne Cunningham permit officer

Please send a stamped self-addressed envelope plus VicRoads Forms. No Photos needed.


Remember it is your responsibility to renew on time. There will be no reminders

Rules regarding club CPS responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist...

- The member has ceased to be financial.
- The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.
- The vehicle is unroadworthy.
- The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.
- The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.



Yarra Boulevard and Teddy Bears Picnic in Canterbury gardens


Come and join us for a ride along the Yarra Boulevard and a Teddy Bears Picnic in Canterbury gardens

Attendance: Approximately 17 members were present together with 7 members via Zoom.

Visitors and New Members: No new members or visitors present.

Acceptance of Minutes:

Minutes of the previous meeting held 10th February 2022 accepted on the motion of Stewart Carr and seconded by lan Kuhne.

President's Report: As per the Generator.

Secretary's Report: Various items of information have been received by email and forwarded to appropriate office bearers. A letter of thanks was sent to Mike Dobson for all the excellent work he has done for the club in regularly organising our Australia Day event and a reply email from Mike was received thanking us for this letter. Advice received of the 2022 Drouin Swap Meet being held at Lardner Park on Sunday 10th April, the 45th Historic Winton Races to be held at the Winton Raceway on 28th & 29th May (proof of vaccination will be required for this event); the Hobsons Bay Men's Shed Motoring Group's Custom Classic Car & Bike show on 20th November, and the

Yarra Glen Swap Meet to be held on Sunday 13th March. The AOMC advised that anyone attending the Yarra Glen Swap Meet to be held at the Yarra Glen Racecourse will need to register using the QR Code and also confirm their vaccination status. This is to meet the requirements of Racing Victoria for people entering one of their sites. Enquiries received about the sale of Morris Minors and/or parts, etc.

Treasurer's Report: Katie advised that we have a current operating balance of \$4,595.64. With our term deposit of \$8,497.26 we have a combined balance of our accounts of \$13,092.90. 42 Membership renewals have been paid so far.

Membership Officer's Report: As per the Generator. Jim advised that we currently have 179 members and 7 Life members.

Club Captain's Report: Nil as we no longer have a Club Captain. Jim advised that we have our upcoming run to the Upper Yarra Museum & Lotus Gardens followed by the Teddy Bear's Picnic in April. Details of these are in the Generator. The Morrykhana is to be held in May. For June as the Point Cook Air Museum is reopening it is proposed to have a run around Williamstown and Altona ending up at the Museum followed by say a lunch at the Altona RSL. Ed is to help coordinate this event but will need someone local to assist. In July Wayne is organising the Christmas in July event at the Melton Harness Racing track. We are looking for good ideas for runs for the second half of the year. We are still looking for someone to undertake the role of Club Captain.

CPS Officer's Report: Wayne absent but as per the Generator we presently have 99 cars on club plates registered to 77 members.

Treasurer's Report for 2020-2021 Club Year

Our accounts have been independently audited and the full audit report is available on request. A summary of our annual accounts is as follows:

There were no known outstanding liabilities or debts against the club.

The term deposit held by the Bendigo Bank was rolled over on 13 April 2021 and will mature on 13 November 2021.

As we are a not-for-profit entity and our assessable income does not exceed the minimum threshold of \$416.00 we do not need to submit a tax return. The appropriate paperwork will however be submitted following this meeting.

For the financial year of 2020-2021 the MMCCV Inc. recorded a provisional before tax surplus of \$50.95. This compares to the previous years before tax deficit of \$997.67.

The income and expenditure has been markedly reduced due to COVID 19 restrictions with some costs down and others increasing. The current financial status of the club remains very sound and as such the current annual Membership fees are to remain the same.

Morris Minor Tales:

This section of The Generator is for all members who wish to submit stories, pictures and items of interest to our members.

Motorama Longford & Penguin Hill Climb

As some of you older members might recall the town of Longford (Tasmania) held for many years (1955-1968) a yearly race meeting for F1 cars, production cars and motorcycles. It became part of the Tasman Series of races held after the Grand Prix season in Europe which is one of the reasons Australia ended up with some significant racing cars such as Ferrari, Maserati, Lago Talbot etc, the grand prix teams selling off their cars after each season. New Zealand also formed part of the Tasman Series.

Much of the old track is still in evidence although the traveller wouldn't know as the Longford Council fails to recognise its past, some sections either swallowed up by modern infrastructure or left to be overgrown with grass and weeds. Indeed, a pity.

However, for the past few years on the March long weekend, Longford comes alive once more to the sound of engines and a number of ex Longford cars and bikes are put through their paces at the nearby Symmons Plains motor racing circuit and are displayed on the Village Green the following day.

"What's this got to do with Morris Minors", I hear you say?

Well, the first thing although a bit tentative was that my Godfather won the Tasmanian Trophy race in 1955 with a Bugatti. He also built up my Coventry Climax engined Morris Minor five years later. My car never raced at Longford,

but a friend of mine drove it to Longford for the "cold radiator day" whilst I took another car.

My Morris was parked near another Morris Minor a ex Longford, Symmons Plains and Baskerville racing car that held many records in its day and still holds a couple of class records to this day.

Under the bonnet it looks like a typical Minor 1000 engine until you notice the Weber carburettor, roll bar and the period Smiths instruments on the dashboard. I was told this car could be bought, the price being around \$22,000.

Both this and my car attracted a lot of attention, but all was not well on the way home the Climax Morris running out of petrol just outside our front gate. Sourcing high-octane fuel on a Sunday afternoon is impossible so with 91 octane to hand, (courtesy of the lawn-mower) she pinked her way back into the garage.

Another famous track in Tasmania is a hill climb situated just outside the town of Penguin. The track was first used in 1955 and closed down in 1971.

Through the Morris Minor Club of Tasmania, I was fortunate to meet Mr. Ken Walker who competed in his first race in 1963 in the wet and recorded a time of 55.7 seconds achieving F.T.D. To put this time into perspective, the length of the course was 1126 metres or 7/10ths of a mile with a 22.5:1 gradient. In the dry, the year before he managed 52.95 seconds.


Ken hadn't been in a Minor for years, so I took him for a ride in my car touching just on 90 mph down a back road here that sees very little traffic. He was like a little kid in a candy shop as the "memories kept pouring back". Even the sound of the chronometric tachometer, was a memory.

That day will be etched in my memory for years.




