#### **New Permits:**

You must be either a life member or a paid-up club member for 6 months or more before you can apply for a new permit and you must include \$20 in cash or cheque, payable to the MMCCV.

When applying for a Permit for a...

<u>Morris Minor</u>. Please Send a <u>Current RWC</u>, with Proof of ownership, VicRoads Club Permit application, Vehicle eligibility and standard declaration for club permit vehicle.

<u>Non-Morris Minor</u>. The request must be accompanied by all of the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor, held in the name of the applicant.

In addition to the above, 6 recent photos 1: Front, 2: Rear, 3: Driver's side, 4: Driving position (side-on with driver's door open), 5: Chassis number or ID plate, 6: Engine Bay.

You must clearly sign and date the rear side of each of the 6 photos.

#### **Renewals:**

Do not forget to sign your renewal application.

If not signed it will be returned to you and so waste valuable time and postage.

Please send a stamped self-addressed envelope plus VicRoads Forms. No Photos needed.

Remember it is your responsibility to renew on time. There will be no reminders


## Rules regarding club CPS responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist...

- The member has ceased to be financial.
- The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.
- The vehicle is unroadworthy.
- The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.
- The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

## GENERAL MEETING MINUTES OF THE MORRIS MINOR CAR CLUB OF VICTORIA INC.

### HELD VIA ZOOM ON THURSDAY 11<sup>™</sup> NOVEMBER 2021

The President welcomed the members present online and opened the meeting at 8.05pm.

**Committee members present**: President: Braidy Davies; Vice President: Stewart Carr; Treasurer: Katie Hamilton; Secretary: Ed James; Editor: Barb Went; Membership: Jim Gourlay; Regalia: Alan Todd; and Webmaster: John Druery.

**Attendance**: Approximately 28 members were present via Zoom.

Apologies: Wayne Cunningham.

**Visitors and New Members**: New members Ian Hamilton who has a 1956 Morris Minor, and Tammie Barker who has rejoined the club.

### **Acceptance of Minutes**

Minutes of the previous meeting held 14<sup>th</sup> October 2021 accepted on the motion of Mike Dobson and seconded by Braidy Davies.

**President's Report**: As per the Generator.

**Secretary's Report**: Various items of information have been received by email and forwarded to appropriate office bearers. The AOMC has advised of the RACV British and European Car Show on 20 February 2022. Ed advised that other club magazines are being progressively forwarded to those members who have requested them. A lot of enquiries received about the sale of Morris Minors and/or parts and for the donated of parts, magazines, etc.

**Treasurer's Report**: Katie advised that we have a current operating balance of \$4,272.55. With our term deposit of \$8,482.34 gives a combined balance of our accounts of \$12,754.89. The term deposit matures on 13<sup>th</sup> November and has been renewed for 7 months at an interest rate of 0.3% per annum. Our annual insurance policy has been paid together with payments for regalia items purchased.

**Membership Officer's Report**: As per the Generator. Jim advised that we currently have 177 members and 7 Life members.

Club Captain's Report: Nil as we no longer have a Club Captain. Jim provided an update of plans for future events. We are looking for volunteers to coordinate each run. A coordinator is need for the proposed Blue Lotus Water Garden at Yarra Junction which is planned for the 3<sup>rd</sup> weekend in March. Arrangements for this will be left to closer to the date. Other proposed runs discussed were a run from Williamstown to the Point Cook Airforce Museum, and to the McClelland Sculpture Park and Gallery. Ron is organising a run later next year.

**CPS Officer's Report**: Nil as Wayne absent. As per the Generator we presently have 96 cars on club plates. Mark Parritt suggested it would be good to know how many members have the 96 cars. He was advised that number was spread across 74 members.

**Regalia Officers:** Alan advised that he has had made up 20 T shirts which he will be taking to the Day of the Morris Minor to sell. They are to be sold for \$25 each and 10 have already been Page **17** of **24** 

sold. He is taking orders for the next production run of these T shirts which come in sizes: S, M, L, XL, XL1 & XL2. He has some orders for polo shirts and needs to order at least 20 of these to be viable. He will bring this up and take further orders at the January meeting. Neil Cheney has been making pens from wood salvaged from a Morris Minor 'Woody' and suggested these could be used for Christmas gifts, etc.

**Editor's Report**: Barb advised that there is not much to report. She is after more articles from members to put in the Generator. If anyone has issues or comments with what has been printed in the Generator they should feel free to contact her to discuss. Ian Hamilton advised that Minor Magic's phone number is wrong in the Generator.

### **GENERAL BUSINESS**

- 1. The Christmas Breakup is to be held at the Veneto Club at 6.00pm on 2<sup>nd</sup> December will cost \$35 per head. Everyone has to be double vaccinated. At least 40 people are coming at present and those coming need to pay if they have not already done so. This needs to be done at least a week beforehand.

For sale is a white 1959, 4-door manual Morris Minor 1000 in working order and still driven around today.

Owned since 1984 (37 years) and has been regularly serviced by professional tradespeople. The car has been keptunder cover the entire 37 years owned - 19 years under a carport and for the last 18 years inside a garage. Only used for private use and local driving.

In overall good condition and comes with owner's manual, repair papers (some), the front passenger seat (to be

installed by the buyer) and countless spare parts that have been accumulated over many years. Registered until June 2022 but will be sold without a Road Worthy Certificate and without the registration plates. New clutch kit installed in March 2021. Brakes professionally inspected and repaired in August 2021.

Most (> 90%) engine parts are Morris Minor brand – except horn, radiator and electronic fuel pump. Upholstery (of seats and sides) is in good condition with no tears or damage but roof needs re-upholstering. The front passenger seat has never been used since being re-upholstered.
