President Report February 2022

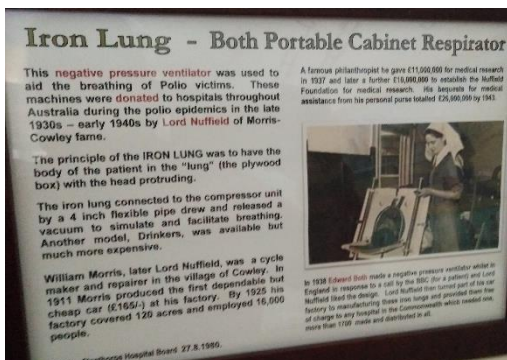
The last meeting with the sausage sizzle was not entirely well attended but enthusiastically attended. We were still chatting at 10.30pm! The sausages and salad disappeared with no one going hungry. Thanks to Mike Dobson for supplying the BBQ and to Marcus Ball for all the salads and bread and drink etc. Well done.

We are going to continue to attempt to have proper meetings at the Hall as we need to get on with things as much as possible. This does not mean we will be dumping the Zoom connection as there are a number of people who can't make the hall meetings. It's also good for those who don't feel comfortable enough with crowds which I completely understand – I haven't managed to get to the movies yet. If there are any improvements, we can make to the meetings to make the Zoom meetings easier to watch please let me know.

January has not been much of a Morry month with the small exception of the breakdown I had on the Eastern freeway heading to the last meeting. Blasting along at 80km/hour and I slowly cruised to a stop. This sounds very calm but when you are stationery and cars are passing within inches of you at 100km/hour it's a bit daunting. So, nothing is happening when I put my foot on the accelerator, but the ignition is still on and the starter motor turns over so probably not electrical. Fuel gauge shows half full. If in doubt throw the bonnet open and wiggle a few leads – nope all tight, but what is this hose doing floating around and why is there a smell of petrol? Reattach hose to the mechanical petrol pump, used the electrical petrol pump to top up the fuel and away I go. Percy and I had fixed the other side of the petrol pump recently (which stopped the smell of petrol happening) so a gentle tap with a hammer should have this sorted except when I tried there is no room to swing anything for a gentle tap so just brute strength from the fingers to get the brass nozzle seated properly. It seems to be doing well 3 weeks later so moral of the story is to always have a look under the bonnet even if your mechanical knowledge is rubbish – it might be a loose hose.

I'm sorry I missed the Australia Day BBQ as I was camping on the side of the King River for a few days until there were flood warnings! Our tent (also known as the Taj Mahal) handled the massive amounts of rain reasonably well and we were dry and warm inside. A beautiful part of the world. I was kept in touch and heard there were about 23 people there which was lovely.

The next three runs look like great events and I'm looking forward to them. Trevor's Mystery run is on soon and should be a good run for those who just want to get out in their cars. Please feel free to come along just for the run even if you don't want to eat with a bunch of people.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES OF THE MORRIS MINOR CAR CLUB OF VICTORIA INC.

HELD AT THE HORRIE WATSON HALL, DEEPPENE AND ALSO VIA ZOOM ON THURSDAY 13TH JANUARY 2022

The President welcomed the members present and online and opened the meeting at 8.02pm.

Committee members present: President: Braidy Davies; Vice President: Stewart Carr; Treasurer: Katie Hamilton; Secretary: Ed James; Membership: Jim Gourlay; Regalia: Alan Todd; Webmaster: John Druery and Librarian: Henry Edwards.

Attendance: Approximately 21 members were present together with 5 members via Zoom.

Apologies: Wayne Cunningham, Lyn Waite, Robert Thorpe, Neil & Sue Cheney, Liam Todd, Barb Went, Rob & Trish Smith, and Percy & Cheryl Scicluna.

Visitors and New Members: No new members or visitors present.

Acceptance of Minutes

Minutes of the previous meeting held 11th November 2021 accepted on the motion of Mike Dobson and seconded by Barry Phillips.

President's Report: As per the Generator.

Secretary's Report: Various items of information have been received by email and forwarded to appropriate office bearers. Advice received from the Rotary Club of Torquay about the Great Ocean Road Cruise on Saturday 12th February followed by the Torquay Motor Show on Sunday 13th February. Notice received that the Colac Show 'n' Shine is on Saturday 19th February. Enquiries received about the sale of Morris Minors and/or parts, etc.

Treasurer's Report: Katie advised that we have a current operating balance of \$3,469.64. With our term deposit of \$8,497.26 we have a combined balance of our accounts of \$11,966.90. Approximately \$1,000 was spent on the Day of the Morris Minor with about the same amount received as income on the day making it cost neutral.

Membership Officer's Report: As per the Generator. Jim advised that we currently have 177 members and 7 Life members. No new members since our last meeting.

Club Captain's Report: Nil as we no longer have a Club Captain. Trevor Sarbach advised that we had the incorrect date in the Generator for the Mystery Run. It is being held on 13th February and not 27th February. It is to start at the McDonalds in Bundoora. He needs to

know the numbers a week before the run. Mike Dobson is planning a run to commemorate the 13th Anniversary of Black Saturday on 7th February. It will start with meeting at the Diamond Creek McDonalds at 9.30am for a 10.30am departure. It will finish at the Strathewen Memorial. The Australia Day event at Westerfolds Park which Mike Dobson is also organising will start at 6.30am. Jim suggested we could incorporate into the run to the Blue Lotus Gardens on 20th March a tour of the Upper Yarra Museum at Yarra Junction for those who do not want to go to the gardens. This could be followed up by a bike ride along one of the local bike tracks. Jim is also looking at a different venue for the Teddy Bears' Picnic on 24th April.

CPS Officer's Report: Nil as Wayne absent. As per the Generator we presently have 98 cars on club plates spread across 76 members.

Regalia Officers: Alan advised that we sold approximately \$520 worth of regalia at the Day of the Morris Minor. He advised that details for ordering the new polo tops will be in the next Generator. He anticipates that for the next order he places for the polo tops that approximately half will be for the traditional tops and the other half will be for the new tops. Alan advised that the sale of the new T shirts went really well with 35 being sold. Braidy thanked Alan for running around delivering T shirts before Christmas.

Editor's Report: Barb absent hence no report. She had left a request for any comments on the Generator's new masthead. Feedback was that it was liked by most people. Barb is after more articles from members to put in the Generator.

GENERAL BUSINESS

1. All the feedback on Day of the Morris Minor has been good. The site at the LaTrobe Community Market was considered to be really good. Our signage for entering the site could be improved with additional signs. The categories of the awards need to be looked at closer including a category for an average car with only say 3 modifications. More voting slips were needed;
2. The feedback on the Christmas Party was that it was good without the music. Some members thought the food could have been better. We are looking for suggestions for an alternative venue for the next Christmas Party.
3. Year Service awards handed out.
4. Trevor advised that he had just paid \$266 to register his car with the narrower plates.
5. Braidy thanked Catriona Bruce for donating 2 tickets to the raffle and Neil Cheney who also donated to the raffle 2 pens he had made out of wood from a Woodie.

Moomba Parade

For all those who remember Moomba parades during the late 70's and 80's they were large parades down Swanston Street with huge floats lasting several hours.

Thinking of ways to promote the car club Chester McKaige had the brilliant idea of entering cars from the car club in the "community group" float section.

The year was 1979?
