

FOR QUICK TURNAROUND OF APPLICATIONS AND RENEWALS

PLEASE EMAIL AND SCAN DOCUMENTS WHERE POSSIBLE

It is the Club Member's responsibility to send renewals and applications in a timely manner.

New Permits (Morris Minor and non-Morris Minor Vehicles)

You must be either a life member or financial (paid up) member for a period of 6 months + before you can apply for a new permit. An application fee of \$20 is required. Payment can be made via cash or cheque made out to the MMCCV to the MMCCV Secretary or a Committee member at MMCCV monthly meetings.

When applying for a permit for a:

Morris Minor: Email or mail a copy of the vehicles current RWC, proof of ownership and the following **(2) VicRoads forms** 1. Club Permit Application form. 2. Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration for Club Permit Scheme Vehicle form.

Non-Morris Minor: Applications must be accompanied by all the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor vehicle held in the name of the applicant.

All Morris Minor and Non-Morris Minor applications must include (6) recent photos showing images of: 1. Vehicle front. 2. Vehicle rear. 3. Vehicle driver's side. 4. Vehicle driving position (side on with driver's door open). 5. Chassis number or ID plate. 6. Vehicle engine bay. All mailed photos should be signed and dated on back. Electronic photos are authenticated by email date.

You **must** notify the CPS Officer (Geoff Shepherd) of your red plate permit number within 48 hours of VicRoads issue via email cpsregistrar@morrisminor.vic.org.au and morrisminorclubplates@gmail.com or phone 0419 137 711. Failure to notify the CPS Officer of your club permit number can have serious consequences for the Club and may cause the Club's permit scheme to be suspended by VicRoads for failure to keep up to date records.

Renewals: Do not forget to sign your renewal application. If your application is not signed it will be returned to you. No photos are required for renewal applications.

Please email or, if mailing, send a stamped self-addressed envelope with VicRoads forms. It is your responsibility to renew on time. No renewal reminders will be issued to permit holders.

Rules Regarding Club CPS Responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist:

The member has ceased to be financial.

The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.

The vehicle is unroadworthy.

The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.

The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

The President welcomed the members present and online and opened the meeting at 8.06pm.

Attendance: Approximately 26 members were present together with 3 members via Zoom.

Apologies: Wayne Cunningham, Lyn Waite, Katie Hamilton, Catriona Bruce, Trevor Dangerfield, Liam Todd, Cheryl Scicluna, Mike Dobson, Henry Edwards, Phil Plumbe and Sue Cheney.

Visitors and New Members: No new members or visitors present.

Acceptance of Minutes

Minutes of the previous meeting held 14th April 2022 accepted on the motion of Ross Carr and seconded by Ian Kuhne.

President's Report: As per the Generator.

Secretary's Report: Various items of information have been received by email and forwarded to appropriate office bearers. An invitation to our Mid-Winter luncheon has been sent to the Bendigo Morris Club in addition to those already sent to the Ballarat, Geelong and Central Victorian Morris Minor Clubs. So far replies have been received from the Ballarat and Geelong clubs advising that they will be attending. Advice received of the Cavalcade of Transport event to be held at Trentham Historic Railway Station on 15th May, the Tongala Car & Bike Show to be held on 22nd October, the 3rd Mallee Bull Show and Shine to be held on 18th September at Birchip, and the Geelong Revival Motoring Festival to be held November 25th to 27th. An enquiry was received from someone after a right hand locking handle for a 1959 Morris Minor van. An enquiry was also received asking if any of our members were interested in completing the restoration of a Morris Minor convertible. This restoration request is to be put in the Generator. Enquiries have been received about the sale of Morris Minors and/or parts, etc.

Treasurer's Report: Katie absent but Stewart advised that we have a current operating balance of \$6,830.47. With our term deposit of \$8,497.26 we have a combined balance of our accounts of \$15,327.73.

Membership Officer's Report: As per the Generator. Jim advised that we currently have 180 members and 7 Life members. Approximately 45 membership renewals still have not been paid.

We have one new member just signed up. Details will be in the next Generator.

Club Captain's Report: Nil as we no longer have a Club Captain. Jim advised that next run is being organised by Stewart for 22nd May. Stewart advised we will meet at the outward bound BP at Officer then onto his place as per previous years. Jim advised that Ed and Tim are organising a run around Williamstown and then hopefully to the RAAF Point Cook Museum on 26th June followed by lunch at the Altona RSL. If the Museum has not reopened by then we will look at another venue. Braidy is organising a run on 14th August and we are looking at a tour of the McClelland Sculptor Park say in the 3rd weekend in September. The Morrykana will be held at Roxburgh College on 23rd October. In July the Mid-Winter lunch is being held at the Melton Harness Racing track. We are still looking for someone to undertake the role of Club Captain.

CPS Officer's Report: Wayne absent but as per the Generator we presently have 101 cars on club plates, 16 of these are non-Morries all registered to 78 members. We have so far this year 4 additional cars on red plates. The CPS records will soon be transferred from Wayne Cunningham to Geoff Shepherd. CPS renewals can now be paid to VicRoads completely online.

Regalia Officers: Alan advised that he has ongoing orders for most regalia items so they can be ordered at any time. Bucket hats have been ordered and will be available in the next 2 months. Plenty of waterproof jackets are available for \$25 each.

Did you know our founding member Dr David Warren (Member #1) invented the Black box still used today?

Thank you to Catriona Bruce, who provided this article. It has been condensed to fit in the Generator.

On Friday 19 October, 1934, the passenger plane Miss Hobart fell from the sky to the sea. The plane's wreckage was never found. One of those on board was a 33-year-old Anglican missionary, Rev Hubert Warren, who had been travelling to his new parish in Enfield, Sydney. His wife Ellie and four children had stayed behind, intending to follow by boat. The reverend's last present to his eight-year-old son, David, had been a crystal radio set that the boy treasured deeply.

David Warren graduated with a science degree from the University of Sydney, a diploma in education from Melbourne University and a PhD in chemistry from Imperial College, London. He worked as a researcher for the Aeronautical Research Laboratories (ARL), a part of Australia's Defence Department. In 1953, the department loaned him to an expert panel trying to solve the cause of the British de Havilland Comet, the world's first commercial jet airliner which keep crashing? 'I found myself dreaming of something I'd seen the week before at Sydney's first postwar trade fair'. That was, what claimed to be the first pocket recorder, the Miniphon. When one of his fellow scientists suggested the latest doomed Comet might have been hijacked, something clicked for him. The chances that a recorder had been on board and survived were basically nil. But what if every plane in the sky had a mini recorder in the cockpit? At the very least, they'd know what the pilots had said and heard. The idea fascinated him. Back at ARL, he rushed to tell his boss about it. Alas, his superior didn't share his enthusiasm. David knew his idea for a cockpit recorder was a good one. He couldn't get it out of his mind. Dr Warren took to his garage and assembled his 20-year-old radio parts. He'd decided the only way to overcome his critics' lack of enthusiasm was to build a solid prototype.


One day in 1958, when the little flight recorder had been finished, the lab received an unusual visitor. Dr Coombes, the chief superintendent, was showing round a friend from England. "Dave!" he said, "Tell him what you're doing!" Dr Warren explained: his world-first prototype which used steel wire to store four hours of pilot voices plus instrument readings and automatically erased older records, so it was reusable. The visitor from England arranged for Dr Warren to go to England to present his invention. He presented "the ARL Flight Memory Unit" to the Royal Aeronautical Establishment and some commercial instrument-makers. They loved it. The British civil aviation authority started work to make the device mandatory in civil aircraft. Though the device started to be called "the black box", they are actually orange so they'd be easier to find after a crash. In 1960, Australia became the first country to make cockpit voice recorders mandatory. Today, black boxes are fire-proof, ocean-proof, encased in steel and are compulsory on every commercial flight.





David Warren worked at ARL until his retirement in 1983, becoming its principal research scientist. He died on 19 July, 2010, at the age of 85.

We found this interesting article about one of our members, Kate Hutson in a copy of Minor Monthly, a no longer published magazine and thought it would be nice to hear the story of Kate and her Blue Convertible Morry "Joyful"



hen he asked me to marry him I said you know what the deal is? I bring the Morris with me."

Despite Kate Hutson moved half way round the world to her new home, her ear was coming with her. The 1959 Convertible had been in her family since new. Kate's grandmother first bought it in Deluxe mode (leather inserts in front seats, manual reverse light, heater and wiper washer) with a smoke grey paintjob.

When the grandmother had finished using it, the Convertible was put aside for inheritance reasons. It wouldn't have been sold, probably on account of Kate's father being mad about Minors. He's only had two cars since learning to drive; both Morris Minor Convertibles.

"I inherited it by default," says Kate, "because I'm the eldest and the first one to pass their driving test got the car. I started messing around with it and doing it up when I was in England. It had been sitting in a shed for a while."

Between the age of seventeen and twenty five, Kate drove the car and looked after it. On her eighteenth birthday her main present was a set of Michelin tyres for the Convertible!

"I've constantly maintained and repaired it. Even after an accident when I first had it and a motorcycle ran into me."

When Kate tied the knot in July 1987, she not only had to pack all her belongings to move down under, but also her Convertible.

"They drove it onto a pallet, built

a timber frame around the car, put it into a container and all the boxes and my personal effects were stacked around it. We filled the container. I think that was the most expensive way of getting it here. There were other options like tying it to the boat."

It took six weeks for the container to arrive in Australia. "Unfortunately it got damaged," says Kate. "I think with the rocking of the boat, the timber rubbed against the car through to bare metal."

Kate reckons there are only thirty six genuine 1000 Convertibles down under, so the import of her car has added to this rare breed.

Over the years the Convertible has seen some mileage. At 230,000 the 948ce motor was changed and is now some 37,000 miles old.

"It's got telescopic shockers at the back because I found the lever arms
