

PLEASE APPLY AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE

New Permits:

You must be either a life member or a paid-up club member for 6 months or more before you can apply for a new permit and you must include \$20 in cash or cheque, payable to the MMCCV.

When applying for a Permit for a...

<u>Morris Minor</u>. Please Send a <u>Current RWC</u>, with Proof of ownership, VicRoads Club Permit application, Vehicle eligibility and standard declaration for club permit vehicle.

<u>Non-Morris Minor</u>. The request must be accompanied by all of the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor, held in the name of the applicant.

In addition to the above, 6 recent photos 1: Front, 2: Rear, 3: Driver's side, 4: Driving position (side-on with driver's door open), 5: Chassis number or ID plate, 6: Engine Bay.

You must clearly sign and date the rear side of each of the 6 photos.

Renewals:

Do not forget to sign your renewal application. If not signed it will be returned to you and so waste valuable time and postage.

Club permit holders Club fees are due by the end of March if not paid by you your car will become unlawful 4 red plates and Vic Road will be notified that you are no longer a member of the car club there is no cooling off period it must be done before the end of March thank you Wayne Cunningham permit officer

Please send a stamped self-addressed envelope plus VicRoads Forms. No Photos needed.


Remember it is your responsibility to renew on time. There will be no reminders

Rules regarding club CPS responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist...

- The member has ceased to be financial.
- The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.
- · The vehicle is unroadworthy.
- The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.
- The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

Last meeting there was discussion over the issue of how to get more people active in the club with some suggestions being bounced around. One idea was to increase the membership fee to \$75 a year and discount it for every event attended. Another idea was to make club plate available only after 3 events had been attended. All viable suggestions and both in place in other car clubs. I know there are clubs out there that cost over \$200 a year to be members and insist on event attendance.

I am personally against any of these moves for a number of reasons. I like the affordability of owning a Morris Minor – I think it suits the car that we accept everyone regardless of their wealth. I am proud that we are the cheapest car club I could find in Victoria. I am against making event attendance compulsory for club permit as people will turn up, sign in and disappear feeling very put out. I would rather people wanted to attend our events and were happy to be there. I appreciate the argument that there many members who don't attend much, and I confess I have been amongst that crowd in the past, but to me that just means we are able to sponsor events and runs with their membership money. Your next President may be an occasional attender at the moment, but you never know what the future will bring. I love that people think about these ideas and are passionate enough to bring them to a meeting. Thank you.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES OF THE MORRIS MINOR CAR CLUB OF VICTORIA INC.

HELD AT THE HORRIE WATSON HALL, DEEPDENE AND ALSO VIA ZOOM ON THURSDAY 10TH FEBRUARY 2022

The President welcomed the members present and online and opened the meeting at 8.02pm.

Committee members present: President: Braidy Davies; Vice President: Stewart Carr; Treasurer: Katie Hamilton; Secretary: Ed James; Editor: Barb Went; Membership: Jim Gourlay; CPS Officer: Wayne Cunningham; Regalia: Alan Todd; Webmaster: John Druery and Librarian: Henry Edwards.

Attendance: Approximately 21 members were present together with 6 members via Zoom.

Apologies: Lyn Waite, Catriona Bruce, Liam Todd, Rob & Trish Smith, and Cheryl Scicluna.

Visitors and New Members: Ian Hamilton who has a sage green 2 door 1956 Morris Minor that was restored by his friend (refer to his story in the November and December 2021 issues of the Generator), and Mark Bosley (Member No. 9) who is doing up a light blue 1955 Morris Minor convertible.

Acceptance of Minutes

Minutes of the previous meeting held 13th January 2022 accepted on the motion of Henry Edwards and seconded by Braidy Davies.

President's Report: As per the Generator.

Secretary's Report: Various items of information have been received by email and forwarded to appropriate office bearers. Advice received of the Swanpool Motor Festival to be held on Sunday 13th March and the Geelong Revival to be held between 4th to 6th March. The AOMC advised that anyone attending the RACV British & European Motoring Show to be held on Sunday 20th February at the Yarra Glen Racecourse will need to register using the QR Code and also confirm their vaccination status. This is to meet the requirements of Racing Victoria for people entering one of their sites. Enquiries received about the sale of Morris Minors and/or parts, etc.

Treasurer's Report: Katie advised that we have a current operating balance of \$3,668.14. With our term deposit of \$8,497.26 we have a combined balance of our accounts of \$12,165.40. Membership fees are due soon and the Renewal of Membership form is in the Generator.

Membership Officer's Report: As per the Generator. Jim advised that we currently have 178 members and 7 Life members. Tanya Wells is our latest new member with her story written up in the current Generator.

Club Captain's Report: Nil as we no longer have a Club Captain. Trevor Sarbach advised that he has made a tentative booking for 20 people for his Mystery Run to be held on 13th February. He has approximately 16 bookings so far. We are still looking for someone to undertake the role of Club Captain.

CPS Officer's Report: As per the Generator. Wayne advised that we presently have 99 cars on club plates with number 99 (Henry's) being registered this week. These are registered to 76 members. Wayne also advised that the Police now have red plate registered cars on their data base so that they can stop any red plated vehicle and check that it matches the recorded registration details.

Regalia Officers: Alan advised that he has received an enquiry for the polo tops with the new logo from Queensland. While the minimum order for the polo tops is 20, Alan is to look into the extra cost for doing smaller runs. Members wanting to order a polo top can choose the colour of the top but nor the colour of the embroidery. Please place your orders as soon as possible with Alan.

Editor's Report: Barb thanked everyone for articles and items submitted to her for inclusion in the Generator. She asked for photos of runs to be sent to her so she can publish them in the Generator and include them with the run report.

GENERAL BUSINESS

- 1. Braidy advised that Trish Smith has formally resigned from being the Club Historian. We are looking for a volunteer to undertake the role. If interested, please contact Jim Gourlay.
- 2. Jim advised future run on 20th March will be a tour of the Upper Yarra Museum at Yarra Junction incorporated with the Blue Lotus Gardens (can choose either or both). These could be followed up by a bike ride along one of the local bike tracks. Jim is planning to have the run for the Teddy Bears' Picnic on 10th April at the Canterbury Gardens.
- 3. Braidy advised that the Florence Thompson Tour for women driving classic and vintage cars will this year be held in the Bendigo area. Please contact her if interested in attending.
- 4. Trevor Sarbach suggested that too many members were not going on the organised tours and that such members should pay an increased membership of say \$75 per year. Members advised that this was tried a couple of years ago at just an increase of membership of \$10 per year. This was voted on and unanimously voted against. It was suggested that this proposal to stimulate more involvement from members should be written up in the Generator for comment.
- 5. Wayne Cunningham had a number of Morris Minor 2022 calendars for sale at \$15 each. These sold very quickly. Wayne advised that they were done though Photobook. It was suggested that if we get a collection of suitable photos together the club could produce such a calendar for next year.
- 6. Henry suggested and it was unanimously supported that a thankyou letter be sent to Mike Dobson for the excellent work he has done for so long in organising the club's Australia Day event.
- 7. Barb asked if Wayne knew when VicRoads will be merging their records system. Wayne advised that apparently all their processes (licensing, fines, registration, customer service, etc.) are being tendered out as a joint venture. The computer systems that hold their records will be upgraded as part of this tendering out process.

In general discussion about getting a roadworthy certificate for Morris Minors with trafficators it was thought best to check with the person to issue the certificate that they are happy to certify such a vehicle as many are either not aware of them or think they are not flashing. Most people also fit indicators in addition to the trafficators.

For an enquiry about determining the year of manufacture of a Morris Minor it was suggested using the body number to check this on the Morris minor Australia Facebook page.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 9.09pm followed by the drawing of the raffle.
