It is the Club Member's responsibility to send renewals and applications in a timely manner.

New Permits (Morris Minor and non-Morris Minor Vehicles and Motorcycles)

You must be either a life member or financial (paid up) member before you can apply for a new permit.

An application fee of \$20 is required. Payment can be made via cash or cheque to the MMCCV Secretary or a Committee member at MMCCV monthly meetings. There is no 6-month membership qualification time for any Morris Minor vehicle for new members.

When applying for a permit for a:

Morris Minor

Email or mail a copy of the vehicles current RWC, proof of ownership and the following **(2) VicRoads forms** 1. Club Permit Application form 2. Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration for Club Permit Scheme Vehicle form.

Non-Morris Minor Vehicles and Motorcycles

Applications must be accompanied by all the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor vehicle held in the name of the applicant. Members wanting to register a non-Morris Minor or motorcycle must have been a member of our Club for at least 6 months.

All Morris Minor and Non-Morris Minor vehicle applications must include (6) recent photos:

Motorcycle photos should include 1,2 & 5 (above) plus LHS RHS views and speedo.

Mailed photos should be signed and dated on back. Electronic photos are authenticated by email date.

You **must** notify the CPS Officer (Geoff Shepherd) of your red plate permit number within 48 hours of VicRoads issue via email to morrisminorclubplates@gmail.com or phone 0419 137 711. Failure to notify the CPS Officer of your club permit number can have serious consequences for the Club and may cause the Club's permit scheme to be suspended by VicRoads for failure to keep up to date records.

Renewals

Remember to sign your renewal application. If your application is not signed it will be returned to you. No photos are required for renewal applications. Please email or, if mailing, send a stamped self-addressed envelope with VicRoads forms. No renewal reminders will be issued to permit holders. Please do not request the CPS Registrar mail your renewal and payment to VicRoads

Rules Regarding Club CPS Responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist:

The member has ceased to be financial.

The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.

The vehicle is unroadworthy.

The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.

The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

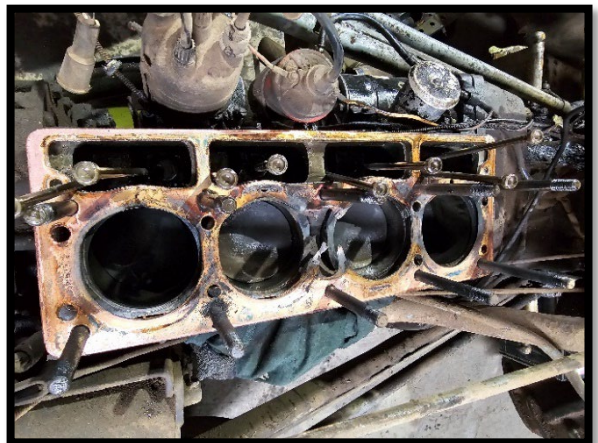
PRESIDENT'S REPORT MAY 2024

We have decided to travel to Port Augusta via the Calder Hwy and Goyder Hwy instead of the National Hwy A1 to avoid major traffic and trucks.

We have chosen holiday parks in most destinations to cater for caravanners, campers and cabin dwellers.

April 2nd - Melbourne to Mildura via Ballarat. About 560kms. Staying at the Big 4 Mildura Getaway Holiday Park.

April 3rd – Mildura to Port Augusta. About 534kms. Staying at the Comfort Inn or the Discovery Parks – Port Augusta.

April 4th – Port Augusta to Ceduna. About 468kms. Staying at the Ceduna Shelly Beach Caravan Park & Beachfront Villas.

Fuel stops across the Nullarbor are - Ceduna, Penong, Nundroo, Nullarbor Roadhouse, Border Village Roadhouse, Eucla, Mundrabilla Roadhouse, Madura, Cocklebidy Roadhouse, Caiguna Roadhouse, Balladonia Truckstop and Norseman. Longest distance between fuel stops is 192km.

April 5th – Ceduna to Eucla. About 492kms. Staying at the Eucla Motel and Caravan Park.

April 6th – Eucla to Balladonia. About 515kms. Staying at the Balladonia Hotel Motel and Caravan Park.

April 7th – Balladonia to Kalgoorlie. About 372 kms. Staying at the Big 4 Acclaim Prospector Holiday Park or the Quality Inn Railway Motel.

April 8th – Kalgoorlie to Merredin. About 334kms. Staying at the Merredin Tourist Park.

April 9th – Merredin to Fremantle. About 383kms. Staying at the Woodman Point Holiday & Caravan Park. BOOK IN EARLY BECAUSE WA SCHOOL HOLS START ON 12TH APRIL AND GOOD FRIDAY IS 18TH April.

April 10th – FREE DAY. Cars booked into BPP Autos (Brian Parkes) for grease and oil change. 9 Eliot Road Perth. 08 9399 3204.

April 11th – Day 1 of rally. Rally check in starts at 1pm. Welcome at 4pm. Move off to the Army Museum of WA. 5pm BBQ dinner.

The club has no outstanding liabilities or debts. The current financial status of the club remains very sound and as such memberships are to remain the same.

As a not-for-profit entity, the required self-assessment of income and expenditure has been conducted. Assessable income did not exceed the minimum threshold of \$416, hence the Club is not required to submit a tax return or pay tax for the financial year 2022-23. The required ATO paperwork will be lodged after the AGM.

The Club recorded a provisional before tax surplus of \$1,564.80. This compares to the previous year's

deficit of \$70.60. This is in part due to hall hire not invoiced to us and a reduction in Generator costs.

The Club accounts have been independently audited and found to represent a true and correct record of the club's income and expenditure for the 2022-23 financial year. A copy of that audit is available to any member who wishes to receive one. I can email that out to anyone who wishes to receive it.

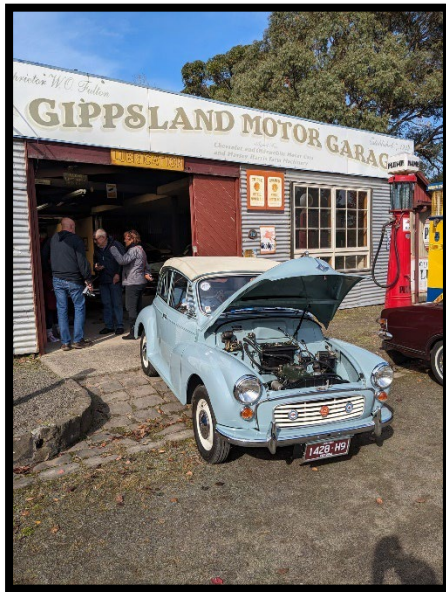

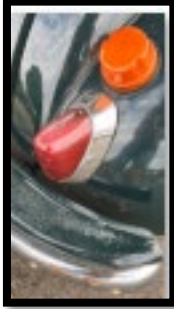

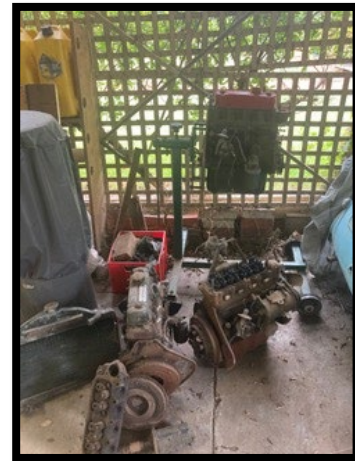
