New Permits:

You must be either a life member; or a paid-up club member for greater than 6 months before you can apply for a new permit and you must include \$20 in cash or cheque, payable to the MMCCV.

When applying for a Permit for a ...

<u>Morris Minor</u>. Please Send a <u>Current RWC</u>, with Proof of ownership, VicRoads Club Permit application, Vehicle eligibility and standard declaration for club permit vehicle.

<u>Non-Morris Minor</u>. The request must be accompanied by all of the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor, held in the name of the applicant.

In addition to the above, 6 recent photos <u>1: Front</u>, <u>2: Rear</u>, <u>3: Driver's side</u>, <u>4: Driving position</u> (side-on with driver's door open), 5: Chassis number or ID plate, <u>6: Engine Bay</u>.

You must clearly sign and date the rear side of each of the 6 photos.

Renewals:

Do not forget to sign your renewal application. If not signed it will be returned to you and so waste valuable time and postage.

Please send a stamped self-addressed envelope plus VicRoads Forms. No Photos needed.

Remember it is your responsibility to renew on time. There will be no reminders

Rules regarding club CPS responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist...

- The member has ceased to be financial.
- The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.
- The vehicle is unroadworthy.
- The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.
- The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.



Hello All

Navigating the lockdown rules is tricky business. A meeting with other club members outside has a limit of 15 people provided they are doubly vaccinated. On a practical level it means that we are not able to visit Henry and Marlene for Cup Day which is a blow but not many people would want a crowd around their house at this time. Then the rules will change on the 18th November! Arrggh. So yet again the next Club meeting will be on line – hopefully for the last time. December is the Christmas dinner – see the note elsewhere, and so maybe January we will have a face to face - I promise pizzas!

Plans are going ahead for the Day of the Morris Minor. Percy and I went to the market last Sunday and it's a great little venue with room for about 100 cars. Voting will finish at noon and the awards presented around 1.00pm. Bringing the correct change would be appreciated as the cost of registration is \$10 to cover the trophies and we do not have tap and go!.



GENERAL MEETING MINUTES OF THE MORRIS MINOR CAR CLUB OF VICTORIA INC.

HELD VIA ZOOM ON THURSDAY 14TH OCTOBER 2021

The President welcomed the members present online and opened the meeting at 8.07pm.

Committee members present: President: Braidy Davies; Vice President: Stewart Carr; Treasurer: Katie Hamilton; Secretary: Ed James; Editor: Barb Went; Membership: Jim Gourlay; CPS Officer: Wayne Cunningham; Regalia: Alan Todd; and Webmaster: John Druery.

Attendance: Approximately 35 members were present via Zoom.

Apologies: Catorina Bruce and Helen Grundy.

Visitors and New Members: New member Joe Foster who has a 1956 Morris Minor.

Acceptance of Minutes

Minutes of the previous meeting held 9th September 2021 accepted on the motion of Rob Smith and seconded by Barb Went.

President's Report: As per the Generator. Braidy advised that she is also on the Committee planning the Florence Thompson tour which is proposed to be held at the end of April/beginning of May next year in Torquay.

Secretary's Report: Various items of information have been received by email and forwarded to appropriate office bearers. Ed advised that an advertisement was received from England about a proposed calendar for next year featuring a Morris Minor. It was suggested that the club could produce its own calendar and this received a favorable response. Barb our Editor said that some of the suggested photos for the calendar could actually be included in the Generator and that she is looking forward to receiving copies of them. Ed advised that other club magazines are being progressively forwarded to those members who have requested them. A number of Morris Minor manuals have been donated to the club which will be redistributed in some way to members. Some enquiries received about the sale of Morris Minors and/or parts.

Treasurer's Report: Katie advised that we have a current operating balance of \$5,002.32. With our term deposit of \$8,482.34 gives a combined balance of our accounts of \$13,484.66. The term deposit is to mature on 13th November and currently earns an interest rate of 0.3% per annum. Our annual insurance policy has been paid. An anonymous donation of \$100.00 has been received.

Membership Officer's Report: As per the Generator. Jim advised that we currently have 175 members and 7 Life members. We have one new member named Joe Foster who has a 1956 Morris Minor which will feature in the next Generator.

Club Captain's Report: Nil as we no longer have a Club Captain. Jim provided an update of plans for future events. We will probably have to cancel the Cup Day run to Henry's due to the

Covid restrictions. For our Christmas Party all attendees will need to be double vaccinated. All our events will need to be based on and be consistent with Government policy. We have had a number of runs proposed. One run suggested is to the Blue Lotus Water Garden at Yarra Junction which is best to see between January and March. We would have to reorganise other events to fit in with these months and an entrance fee would be charged. The membership indicated that they would be interested in paying admission to such a location. The club would look at subsidising some of this cost. A volunteer would be required to run this event. The Morrykana would need to be moved from March so this run could be held in that month. Other events suggested include: a run from Williamstown to the Point Cook Airforce Museum; the McClelland Sculpture Park and Gallery; the Pearcedale Sanctuary; the Frankston Botanical Gardens (featuring all Australian plants); a night tour of the Ararat Jail (Wayne to look at); a run along Beach Road; and a run to Warburton. Mike Dobson is organising a run around the Arthurs Creek area to end up at the Bridges Restaurant. For each run a volunteer will be required to organise it.

Editor's Report: Barb asked for any images of Morris Minors to put in the Generator. She also asked for images to be sent to her of our last run to the B24 Liberator Museum at Werribee as she did not have any for the Generator. She is looking for more items and articles from members for inclusion in the Generator to make it more interesting.

Regalia Report: Alan advised that not much is happening with the Regalia due to the Covid shutdown. Costings for the proposed new emblem have been included in the Generator. Alan asked that if anyone is sitting on any artwork or have dealt with companies in the past who may have some of our artwork to please let him know.

CPS Officer's Report: Wayne advised that as per the Generator we presently have 96 cars on club plates. Wayne advised that VicRoads is changing how Roadworthy Certificates are issued and that they are now being done electronically.

GENERAL BUSINESS

- 1. Club was advised that Henry Edwards has not been receiving a hard copy of the Generator. This will be rectified;
- 2. Braidy reported on the voting received on the proposed new club logo. The voting was 27 votes against changing the logo to 4 votes to change it. Motion therefore carried not to change the club's logo. The new logo will however be made into a T shirt (with no reference to the club) for those members who expressed interest in one (say a run of 20 T shirts);
- 3. Braidy advised that for the Day of the Morris Minor is to be held at the LaTrobe Community Market on Sunday November 21st that there will be a lucky door prize, an area or approximately 80 car parking spaces set aside for us, cars will park as they arrive and some regalia will be for sale. An entry fee of \$10 will be charged per vehicle entered to cover part of the cost of the trophies. No catering will be provided as this will be available at the market. Also, a goodies bag will not be provided. The Ballarat and Geelong clubs have been notified of the event;
- 4. The Christmas Breakup is to be held at the Veneto Club at 6.00pm on 2nd December. People who have paid a deposit for the Mid-Year lunch will have that deposit paid

towards the Christmas Party. Some members have already advised Katie to do this for them. If they did not want it transferred then they need to advise her of this. Cheryl suggested in future years that the Christmas breakup be a lunch held on say a Saturday or Sunday afternoon so more Morries can come along to the event.

My name is Ian Hamilton and I want to thank you for accepting my application to become a member of the Morris Minor Club of Victoria Inc.

I have dreamed of owning a Morris Minor for many years as I learnt to drive in a MM back in the last century. A very good friend of mine, Brian Cook, 'Cookie', who I met the day we commenced Primary School had restored many, many cars over the years, and I had suggested to him on numerous occasions that he should restore a MM. In April this year, sixteen months after he had been diagnosed with mesothelioma, and a few days after my wife, Marilyn and I had returned home to Croydon Hills from visiting Cookie and his wife Merryl on the Sunshine Coast, Cookie rang to tell me that he had bought me a MM. It had been in shed for just over forty years on a property just out of Hervey Bay Qld. He told me he was going to restore it for me before he died.

Cookie passed away on the 29th. June and had almost completed the MM which he wanted me to have in memory of him. With a very small amount of assistance from myself another friend of Cookie's, Ross, completed the restoration, indicating to me on a number of occasions that "his hands (working on the Morrie, named "Mavis") were Cookie's hands." 
