PLEASE APPLY AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE

New Permits:

You must be a paid-up club member for 6 months or more before you can apply for a new permit and you must include \$20 in cash or cheque, payable to the MMCCV.

When applying for a Permit for:...

Morris Minor. Please Send a Current RWC, with Proof of ownership, VicRoads Club Permit application, Vehicle eligibility and standard declaration for club permit vehicle.

Non-Morris Minor. The request must be accompanied by all of the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor, held in the name of the applicant.

In addition to the above, 6 recent photos 1: Front, 2: Rear, 3: Driver's side, 4: Driving position (side-on with driver's door open), 5: Chassis number or ID plate, 6: Engine Bay.

You must clearly sign and date the rear side of each of the 6 photos.

Renewals:

Do not forget to sign your renewal application.

If not signed it will be returned to you and so waste valuable time and postage.

Please send a stamped self-addressed envelope plus VicRoads Forms. No Photos needed.

Remember it is your responsibility to renew on time. There will be no reminders

Rules regarding club CPS responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist...

- The member has ceased to be financial.
- The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.
- The vehicle is unroadworthy.
- The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.
- The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

There is a lot more to the Club Permit Scheme agreement.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES OF THE MORRIS MINOR CAR CLUB OF VICTORIA INC.

HELD VIA ZOOM ON THURSDAY 9TH SEPTEMBER 2021

The President welcomed the members present online and opened the meeting at 8.04pm.

Committee members present: President: Braidy Davies; Vice President: Stewart Carr; Treasurer: Katie Hamilton; Secretary: Ed James; Editor: Barb Went; Membership: Jim Gourlay; CPS Officer: Wayne Cunningham; Regalia: Alan Todd; and Webmaster: John Druery.

Attendance: Approximately 33 members were present via Zoom.

Apologies: Graham & Lesley Dines and Ken Urquhart.

Visitors and New Members: New members are: Malcolm Scott who has a 1960 2 door 1000 series Morris Minor sedan (details in the Generator); Graham Waldron who had a Morris Minor in the 1960's and is looking for another Morris Minor; and Oscar Trapani who as a retired mechanic has had extensive experience over 70 years in repairing and servicing Morris Minors and other vehicles.

Acceptance of Minutes

Minutes of the previous meeting held 12th August 2021 accepted on the motion of Trevor Sarbach and seconded by Barb Went.

President's Report: As per the Generator.

Secretary's Report: Various items of information have been received by email and forwarded to appropriate office bearers. Advice received that the 2021 Geelong Revival has been delayed to

4th – 6th March 2022, the AOMC Shannon's American Motoring Show planned to be held in Yarra Glen on 26th September has been cancelled, the AOMC Winton Festival of Speed 2021 has been cancelled, and the 3rd Mallee Bull Show'n Shine planned for 19th September at Birchip has also been cancelled. Other club magazines are being progressively forwarded to those members who have requested them. Some enquiries received about the sale of Morris Minors and/or parts.

Treasurer's Report: As per the Generator. Katie advised that we have a current operating balance of \$6,562.77. With our term deposit of \$8,482.34 gives a combined balance of our accounts of \$15,045.11. Katie also advised that the renewal of our insurance policy is due on 1st October and that the premium will be approximately \$1,200. Under the policy we need to register certain events.

Membership Officer's Report: As per the Generator. Jim advised that we currently have 174 members and 7 Life members.

Club Captain's Report: Nil as we no longer have a Club Captain. Jim has put a brief description of the Club Captain's position in the Generator. It is more of a Coordinating role than a role where the person does everything. We are looking for people to come up with ideas for runs to say community events or other locations, and particularly new members to come up

with fresh new ideas. The calendar for next year has 5 regular activities and we need say another 7 activities to fill the gaps. At present we have for next year:

- Trevor Sarbach's mystery run has been moved to February;
- Mike Dobson will be organising the Australia Day event;
- Morrykana will be held in March if Stewart still happy to organise it;
- The Mid-Winter dinner will be held in July possibly organised by Wayne;
- Jim is happy to organise a Teddy Bear picnic run in April somewhere in the eastern suburbs;
- Trevor suggested a run to Hanging Rock.

We are looking at possibly a group of members to get together and come up with run ideas and to help organise these runs. You don't actually need a Morris Minor to go on any of the runs. You can go in a modern car if you wish. We most of all want to see people and not necessarily the car on the runs. An hour to an hour and a half from the start of the run is considered to be an upper limit for an afternoon run. It was noted that RACV Total Care only provides free towing for the first 100 kilometres and that we need to keep this in mind when planning runs.

Editor's Report: Braidy thanked Rob for being the Editor for so long and for all the good work he has done in this role and in handing it over to Barb. Barb is now fully carrying out the role as Editor of the Generator and presented her first report. She is looking for more items and articles from members for inclusion in the Generator to make it more interesting.

Regalia Report: Alan advised that Regalia is in a holding pattern at the moment waiting for an actual meeting. The new logo will be discussed separately under General Business.

CPS Officer's Report: Wayne advised that as per the Generator we presently have 95 cars on club plates. For the one new plate application last month they could not go to a VicRoads office so they had to send all of the paperwork to them with a cheque. VicRoads then issued the red plates. Hence, at present we can do all new CPS registrations via mail. Mark Parritt advised that you can pay CPS renewals online together with sending VicRoads the scanned documents. You must put the receipt in the back of your log book.

GENERAL BUSINESS

1. The Mid-Winter Dinner has been cancelled due to COVID and will not be held at all this year. Deposits that have been paid can either be refunded or put towards the Christmas Party. This will be noted in the next Generator;
2. Braidy confirmed that the Day of the Morris Minor is to be held at the LaTrobe Community Market on Sunday November 21st COVID restrictions allowing. The market organisers will be allocating a carpark area for our use and there will be a number of requirements we need to meet;
3. Extensive discussion was held about the positives and negatives of the proposed new logo. The current logo was adopted for the 25th Anniversary of the club in 2002. Neil suggested that if we adopted the new logo that we get a legal opinion on its use to ensure there are no copyright problems.

Motion moved that we put a vote into the Generator on the adoption of the new logo. As part of the voting process the approximate costs of the screen printing, embroidery and legal costs for the new logo is to be provided. If adopted a legal opinion is to be sought on its use.

Alan was thanked for all the work he has done towards the design of the new logo.

Items for Sale / Tips & Hints:

Graham Waldron is after a Morris Minor in good condition.

Scott Anderson is after a Morris Minor but at a later date.

The question was asked if on the Day of the Morris Minor could members sell parts, etc. on the day. Braidy is to follow this up with the Market organisers.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 9.31pm followed by the drawing of the raffle.

Regalia Costing Summary:

Following the last meeting the Regalia team followed up costing for future regalia. Regalia quote from flash branding Ringwood.

At present the artwork flash branding have on file of ours is

- 1. The embroidery logo
- 2. A digital format of the logo on the rain jackets.
- 3. They have no screen print set ups of ours in any form , Given this the costs associated with the new logo are

Costs:

- 1. \$30 for the embroidered logo
- 2. Anything in digital is free because all the art work is done and supplied in the format required.
- 3. Anything in a screen print be it for old or new logo would incur a cost. The cost per colour is \$60. Less colours means less cost.

Just as a finishing comment I've asked many members in the club as to whether there is any artwork of any sort that another company or person might know of with no success. The only club artwork I have been made aware of is with flash branding.

A message from a former Regalia Officer regarding a proposed new regalia item

Firstly, a bit of background. When I took up the position of Club Captain I continued as Regalia Officer until Bruce Kerr briefly performed that function before Alan and Liam Todd filled the position. I can well recall the difficulty the Committee had in finding a volunteer for this position and was very pleased when the Todds came on board with such enthusiasm.

I would like to take this opportunity in thanking Bruce for filling the breach in the interim and to applaud Alan and Liam's efforts in coming up with a new and exciting design for a future new item of regalia, namely, a T-Shirt. I should mention that the new minimalist Morry design was initially intended for said T-Shirt but somehow, on the way, morphed into a new logo for consideration of all Club members.

Regardless of the outcome of the discussion around the possible changing of the current logo, I would like to see the concept of a new T-Shirt with the minimalist design put forward by Alan and Liam, supported and their efforts acknowledged.

I personally consider that such an item could be worn as an iconic item of fashion and be appealing to members of all Morry clubs if there was no reference on the item to our Club (members wishing Club identity could simply affix their name badge).

I have no doubt that an unbranded T-Shirt of iconic/quirky design as proposed would sell well in our Club and at future Club events involving other clubs.

New Club Badge/Logo:

My understanding is that a new badge/logo was originally proposed to go on a t-shirt only, with a small print on the front and a larger one on the back, without any reference to our club. This would enable us to sell the t-shirts as generic items to attract sales from other clubs and the public. If we wish to let people know what club we represent, we could add our club's name badge.

I have no problem with this idea, but when it comes to rebranding our club, I have the following reservations:

- At present we have two badges/logos. One (the round one) is used for letterheads, grill badges, trophies and has been modified from time to time for special occasions e.g. (Fortieth birthday badge and National Rally badge). The second badge is used on our regalia e.g. (hats, shirts, and jackets). As a lot of this regalia has been sold over the years and is regularly worn by many club members, adding another one would suggest to the public and other car clubs that we were from two different clubs.
- I find the proposed badge/logo very nondescript. At first glance, it appears as a series of shapes rather than a Morris Minor, whereas the current badges/logos are unquestionably Morris.
- My other concern is that very little regalia is worn to meetings and runs by our newer members. Older members possessing plenty of regalia that they wear regularly would be reluctant to purchase new items. For example, I have 2 x polo shirts, 2 x caps, a jacket, a short-sleeved and long-sleeved cotton shirt, a jumper, and a vest. Sue, my wife, has a t-shirt, a polo shirt, a vest and a jacket.
- The Morris Minor Car Club of Victoria is probably the oldest and the largest Morris Minor Club in Australia. We are known throughout the country as we have attended most National Rallies, Albury Morrie Musters, Day of the Morris Minor, and many other interclub events. Our regalia badges/logos are well known and easily recognised. If we rebranded our club, this would not be the case and we would appear to be two clubs for a very long time. That is providing members purchase and wear the new regalia.

This is some of my reasoning for not rebranding the club. It is now up to the club members to decide.

NOTICE OF DECISION
Road Safety (Vehicles) Regulations 2021

I, Ben Carroll, Minister for Roads and Road Safety and Minister responsible for administering the *Road Safety Act 1986*, give notice in accordance with section 12 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1994* of my decision to make the proposed Road Safety (Vehicles) Regulations 2021 (the proposed Regulations).

A regulatory impact statement in relation to the proposed Regulations was made available for public comment from 11 June 2021 until 8 July 2021. The Department of Transport received 1060 submissions.

After consideration of the submissions in accordance with section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1994*, I have decided to proceed with the making of the proposed Regulations with the following amendments:

- Maintaining the eligibility for club permit registration at 25 years (there was consideration of increasing the eligibility to 30 years).
- Reinserting regulations relating to the Hazardous Area Authority. These requirements are to remain in the proposed Regulations until corresponding amendments are to be made to the Bus Safety Regulations 2020.
- Amendment of penalty amounts for certain offences under the proposed Regulations.
- Other minor, miscellaneous, and technical amendments.

The following regulatory requirements have also been omitted from the proposed Regulations. However, I intend to implement these reforms through amendments to the proposed Regulations after the proposed Regulations commence:

- Regulations which would have required vehicles over 15 years of age to be recorded on the written-off vehicles register when classified as a statutory write-off or a repairable write-off.
- Requiring light vehicles or light trailers with a fixed gas fitting to present a gas certificate or gas compliance plate at the time of registration of that vehicle or trailer.
- Amendment of the eligibility for registration concession by charitable or benevolent organisations.
