PLEASE EMAIL AND SCAN DOCUMENTS WHERE POSSIBLE

It is the Club Member's responsibility to send renewals and applications in a timely manner.

New Permits (Morris Minor and non-Morris Minor Vehicles)

You must be either a life member or financial (paid up) member for a period of 6 months + before you can apply for a new permit. An application fee of \$20 is required. Payment can be made via cash or cheque made out to the MMCCV to the MMCCV Secretary or a Committee member at MMCCV monthly meetings.

When applying for a permit for a:

Morris Minor: Email or mail a copy of the vehicles current RWC, proof of ownership and the following **(2) VicRoads forms** 1. Club Permit Application form. 2. Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration for Club Permit Scheme Vehicle form.

Non-Morris Minor: Applications must be accompanied by all the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor vehicle held in the name of the applicant.

All Morris Minor and Non-Morris Minor applications must include (6) recent photos showing images of: 1. Vehicle front. 2. Vehicle rear. 3. Vehicle driver's side. 4. Vehicle driving position (side on with driver's door open). 5. Chassis number or ID plate. 6. Vehicle engine bay. All mailed photos should be signed and dated on back. Electronic photos are authenticated by email date.

You **must** notify the CPS Officer (Geoff Shepherd) of your red plate permit number within 48 hours of VicRoads issue via email cpsregistrar@morrisminorvic.org.au and morrisminorclubplates@gmail.com or phone 0419 137 711. Failure to notify the CPS Officer of your club permit number can have serious consequences for the Club and may cause the Club's permit scheme to be suspended by VicRoads for failure to keep up to date records.

Renewals: Do not forget to sign your renewal application. If your application is not signed it will be returned to you. No photos are required for renewal applications.

Please email or, if mailing, send a stamped self-addressed envelope with VicRoads forms. It is your responsibility to renew on time. No renewal reminders will be issued to permit holders.

Rules Regarding Club CPS Responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist:

The member has ceased to be financial. The vehicle is being used for commercial gain. The vehicle is unroadworthy. The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates. The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES OF THE MORRIS MINOR CAR CLUB OF VICTORIA INC.

HELD AT THE HORRIE WATSON HALL, DEEPDENE AND ALSO VIA ZOOM ON

THURSDAY 8 TH SEPTEMBER 2022

The President welcomed the members present and online and opened the meeting at 8.02pm.

Committee Members Present: President: Stewart Carr; Treasurer: Katie Hamilton;

Secretary: Ed James; Membership: Jim Gourlay; and CPS Officer: Geoff Shepherd.

Attendance: Approximately 15 members were present together with 7 members via Zoom.

Apologies: Barb Went, Alan & Dodd (Alan arrived later to the meeting), Catriona Bruce, Percy &

Cheryl Scicluna, Henry Edwards, Marcus Ball, Ross and Anne Carr, and Geoff Nougher.

Visitors and New Members: Reece visiting from New Zealand spoke about the regalia he had together with his sheds full of Morris Minor parts, and new member Eric Holton who has a number of Morris Minors.

Acceptance of Minutes:

Minutes of the previous meeting held 11 th August 2022 accepted on the motion of Graham Harper and seconded by Jim Gourlay.

President's Report: As per the Generator.

Secretary's Report: Various items of information have been received by email and forwarded to appropriate office bearers. Some enquiries received about the sale of Morris Minors and/or parts together with technical requests. These have been referred to appropriate persons.

Treasurer's Report: Katie advised that we have a current operating balance of \$6,020.61. With our term deposit of \$8,512.07 we have a combined balance of our accounts of \$14,532.68. Membership Officer's Report: As per the Generator. Jim advised that we currently have 184 members including 7 Life members. We have 7 more members than what we had at the same time last year and over recent years the numbers have been increasing steadily each year.

Club Captain's Report: While we no longer have a Club Captain, various members spoke about upcoming events. Mark Parritt gave details of the run to the McClelland Gallery on 25 th September, Stewart spoke about the Morrykana to be held on 9 th October at Roxburgh College, and the Geelong club's memorial car club run to Daylesford on Sunday 23 rd October which we are participating in. The November run on Melbourne Cup day will be to the Yan Yean Reservoir. Eric volunteered to help set this up. The Christmas function is at the Manningham Club. For next year we have events organised to March together with the National Rally but are looking for people to organise runs after then.

CPS Officer's Report: Geoff advised that we presently have 101 cars on club plates. He said that so far he has processed 22 registration renewals since he took over at the beginning of May and that the digital system was working well. Geoff also advised that the Committee had decided to allow motorcycles to be registered under the club's Club Permit Scheme providing they already have a registered Morris Minor and have been a member of the club for atleast 6 months. The Committee has also decided to drop the 6 month waiting period for new members to register a Morris Minor under our Club Permit scheme as this was discouraging some potential members from joining our club. The 6 months waiting period still applies for vehicles other than a Morris Minor.

Regalia Officers: Alan has most items in stock now and that a T shirt is being designed for the National Rally.

Editor's Report: Nil as Barb absent.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

- 1. Mark Parritt gave an update on the preparations for the National Rally. Details of dates, accommodation, etc. are in the Generator. Mark stressed the need to book accommodation, etc. now. In November members going will have a brief gathering to discuss more specific details of the trip.

My Two Minors

With another car on the hoist it was a perfect opportunity to photograph both cars together, a two door and four door Minor 1000. Both cars were manufactured in 1957 (me included, and Ross Carr will tell you where). In fact, there is only a couple of hundred cars separating them.

The white 1000 and the green car were both distributed by Lanes Motors then in Exhibition Street, Melbourne. I don't know how many owners it had but I can trace back the last two, Emily Taylor of Werribee, and John Irving who was/is a member of the Club. Emily's father Ed paid all the bills and I have a collection of them going back to year 2,000. Most of the spare parts were bought from Morris Minor Australia, and Richard Milligan had done a couple of stints cutting out rust etc.

The next owner was John Irving who kept up the tradition of keeping all the receipts for work done. I must admit that over the years I have been a bit tardy of this exercise. It was registered XSB 404 and from what I can gather attended quite a few club events.

Now around 2014, the Irving's moved to Tasmania and I got to know John from his interests in MGs. At that time I didn't know he had a Morris Minor. One of our close neighbor's happened to see an advertisement advertising a Morris Minor for sale and mentioned it to me as he new I was interested in the marque. His son was learning to drive and I suggested a Morris (not being automatic) would be a good car to learn on. When I learnt it belonged to John, I immediately thought it would be a very well maintained car so I had no hesitation in buying it. At that stage it was on Tasmanian Special Interest plates SI 7130.

The good news out of all this was my neighbor's son discovered girls and I think wanted something a bit more "interesting". I think the term these days is "chick magnet". Anyway the gears in the gearbox were saved and the car lived to fight another day. Incidentally, I've owned seven Minors over the years, and this one has the best gearbox by far.

I bought the car in 2019 and put it on full registration 189PL. I have done a few things to it namely new clutch and the removal and replacement of indicators both front, back and side mounted trafficators. The spring steel strip that separates the points had lost its "spring" if it ever had any and was replaced with a new set. Well, what a difference in performance! I'm convinced that the engine has had some work done to it particularly the head. It gets used regularly on Morris Minor club runs here, and now with the price of petrol, will get used even more. On full registration, it has to earn its keep!


The green car has only had two previous owner's (I'm the third) a Miss. Phyllis Davis of North Caulfield who bought it new and registered it GSR 800. She kept it for two years before selling it to Lyndon Duckett of Toorak. This car is well documented and is fitted with a Coventry Climax 1100 cc engine and MG TC gearbox. The mileage is a genuine 18,300 most of which were achieved on racing tracks and hill climbs throughout Victoria. I have run it at Symmons Plains here and a couple of Longford Reunions. It gets used now and again and although it has been detuned from running on Methanol (14:1), it still finds 98 RON has to be used to stop pinking. Good luck with anything under.
















The 2023 Morris Minor National Rally

presents

"Dressed for Driving"

The 2023 Morris Minor National Rally celebrates 75 years of Morris Minor motoring. The Morris Minor's variety, durability, reliability, affordability and its changing of faces to match the latest in design for the day ensured the Minor's evolution and production over such a long and seminal time in the 20th Century.

Emerging from the post war ashes, the Morris Minor gave the public a new car, the practicality and affordability of which meant that Morris vehicles (including the then new Minors) represented nearly seven percent of all cars on the road in Australia by 1950. The Australia Bureau of Statistics

ranked Morris in the top five makes of cars on Australian roads by 1950 and they remained dominant on the Australian roads, even with Ford and Holden offering tempting choices into the motoring market. This gave the Minor a fabulous head start in the market share, a sound choice for many at a time when fuel was still rationed and only one in four households owned a car. Indeed one advertising poster of 1954, boasted "You can afford two cars if one is a Morris Minor". A bold claim when car ownership was still considered a major investment. This all but ensured its enduring appeal & presence on our Australian roads.





Some might be surprised to understand that fashion and motoring are inextricably linked. Many who look back through the history of motoring will notice that fashions in clothing have strong associations with their corresponding motoring styles and own fashion trends. Together, especially in the context of historical motoring, they cannot do justice to each other without the accurate pairing of the two.

Only when the two are presented together with articulation and authenticity can the true feel of the era be relived, with a level of nostalgia that we as people often instinctively crave.

As such the 2023 Morris Minor National Rally also has included with it an invitation for participants in the wearing of historic costume of their choosing. For some, this may simply mean

digging out old clothes and wash off the odour of mothballs. For others however, it may

be a worthy challenge, a dedication to the cause in of itself. This will give participants the opportunity to showcase a true fashion time capsule, that is, fashion paired with the year and style of your vehicle.

While clothing styles are not always so specific as to pinpoint a specific year, it is appropriate that fashions accompanying a car in 1950 could include wartime austerity fashions. However by the 1960's the fashions and accessories will be very different to that in 1950. Much changed in that decade alone. A lady of 1950 would most likely still wear a hat and gloves driving to the shops, and might be wearing repurposed clothing. However a young woman of 1965 would probably choose not follow her mother's fashion style, be in the up to date, much affordable fashions, and might choose to be hatless and gloveless, or even heaven forbid mini skirts and knee high boots!



Just like vintage cars, some clothing may be found in perfect unaltered condition, fit perfectly

& require no improvement. However, like some old Minors, some garments may need a little help to refresh the style, or completely new garments may need to be constructed & complimented with original accessories. As original garments and newly made garments cannot be considered totally equal, each type will be judged in their own categories so that no-one should feel excluded, regardless of size opportunity, fashion date & common constraints in reproducing historical looks. Sourcing fabrics for reproduction garments can be especially challenging (just like original spare parts of vintage cars)!

We would encourage as many participants as possible to dress in era-appropriate attire, even if not to enter the competition. In doing so, we increase the sense of historical value these beautiful & practical vehicles represent, & offer the public who interact with us, a chance to feel the time and history our cars have lived. For many of the public, the care will represent a time they were not present for

of the public, the cars will represent a time they were not present for, & this enhances both the enjoyment of the participants and the public alike.

What Will the Judges be Looking For?

The judges will be looking for accuracy and overall presentation, with special attention paid to accessories including footwear, headwear, handbags, gloves, jewellery and hair and makeup. The men might even want to pay attention to owning vintage watches and wallets, and a good pair of braces was a mens wardrobe staple!

Whether entering as an individual or family, fashion ensembles should closely match the **year** in which the car was manufactured. Stereotyped or generic retro fashions are often not very historically accurate, so research is recommended when making your ensemble!

Online resources for vintage fashion and stylings are prolific, and like cars, some fashions are even dateable from a specific year onwards. Judging will be made available separately for both the Saturday

and Sunday, as well awards for costuming the entire event. Lastly, history bounders will be placed in a category all of their own and recognised for doing so. Vintage pic-nic gear, transistor radios, there is no limit to historical accuracy, so lets feel free to enjoy the event to its fullest opportunity!.
