New Permits:

You must be a paid-up club member for 6 months or more before you can apply for a new permit and you must include \$20 in cash or cheque, payable to the MMCCV.

When applying for a Permit for a...

<u>Morris Minor</u>. Please Send a <u>Current RWC</u>, with Proof of ownership, VicRoads Club Permit application, Vehicle eligibility and standard declaration for club permit vehicle.

Non-Morris Minor. The request must be accompanied by all of the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor, held in the name of the applicant.

In addition to the above, 6 recent photos 1: Front, 2: Rear, 3: Driver's side, 4: Driving position (side-on with driver's door open), 5: Chassis number or ID plate, 6: Engine Bay.

You must clearly sign and date the rear side of each of the 6 photos.

Renewals:

Do not forget to sign your renewal application.

If not signed it will be returned to you and so waste valuable time and postage.

Please send a stamped self-addressed envelope plus VicRoads Forms. No Photos needed.

Remember it is your responsibility to renew on time. There will be no reminders

Rules regarding club CPS responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist...


- The member has ceased to be financial.
- The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.
- The vehicle is unroadworthy.
- The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.
- The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES OF THE MORRIS MINOR CAR CLUB OF VICTORIA INC.

HELD VIA ZOOM ON THURSDAY 12TH AUGUST 2021

The President welcomed the members present online and opened the meeting at 8.10pm.

Committee members present: President: Braidy Davies; Vice President: Stewart Carr; Secretary: Ed James; Editor: Rob Smith; Assistant Editor: Barb Went; Membership: Jim Gourlay:

CPS Officer: Wayne Cunningham; Regalia: Alan Todd; and Webmaster: John Druery.

Attendance: Approximately 21 members were present via Zoom.

Apologies: Katie Hamilton, Marcus Ross Carr, Graham & Lesley Dines, and Geoff Noire.

Acceptance of Minutes

Minutes of the previous meeting held 8th July 2021 accepted on the motion of Wayne Cunningham and seconded by Braidy Davies.

President's Report: As per the Generator. Braidy apologised that she was unable on behalf of the club to make comments to the AOMC about the VicRoads proposed changes to the Club Permit Scheme.

Secretary's Report: Various magazines, flyers and emails received. Most correspondence received has been included in the Generator. Advice received that the Old Gippstown Fathers' Day Car Show that was to be held in Moe has been cancelled. Also, the Australian National Show and Shine to be held in Euroa is at this stage still being planned for 3rd October. Ed will attempt to forward the backlog of other club magazines to those who have requested them if it does not cause his computer to crash again. Some enquiries received about the sale of Morris Minors and/or parts.

Treasurer's Report: As per the Generator. Katie absent but had provided the advice that we have a current operating balance of \$6,905.46. With our term deposit of \$8,482.34 this gives a combined balance of our accounts of \$15,387.80.

Membership Officer's Report: As per the Generator. Jim advised that we currently have 174 members and 7 Life members. We have 4 new members this month.

Club Captain's Report: Nil as we no longer have a Club Captain.

CPS Officer's Report: Wayne advised that as per the Generator we presently have 95 cars on club plates. We have 2 new cars on the register and one other vehicle has left since our last meeting. Advice received from the AOMC that the CPS number plates are now available from VicRoads in a slim line format. These cost \$185 for a pair of plates and \$125 for just one plate. Also, old or damaged number plates can now be replaced with the same number. One replacement plate costs \$35.60 while two costs \$71.20. These options are not available for M type CPS plates.

Editor's Report: Rob advised not much to report except changeover to Barb fully carrying out the role has been taking longer than expected. Barb should be fully producing the next Generator.

Regalia Report: Alan advised that the T shirts can be ready for sale at next month's meeting if it is held at the clubrooms. A discussion was held about the design of the new logo. Richard McKellar made some suggestions for changes to the design. After these changes have been made the new logo is to be put in the Generator and voted on at a forthcoming meeting.

GENERAL BUSINESS

- 1. Braidy has been looking at holding the Day of the Morris Minor at the LaTrobe (Kingsbury) Community Market on either November 14th or 21st. The market organisers are prepared to lockdown a carpark area for us to use. Prizes will be given in 8 or 10 categories;
- 2. The Mid-Winter Dinner has been cancelled due to COVID. Wayne is trying to change it to 26th September 2021;
- 3. Discussion held about revising and simplifying the role of the Club Captain. It was thought the role should be more of a coordinator who amongst other things communicates with the Committee and puts information in the Generator. We need to organise a subcommittee to support the Club Captain's role which would identify events and then ask for volunteers to organise each run. Each run coordinator will be given a guide on how to organise a run. The subcommittee is to set up a calendar of events for 2022 and we are looking for volunteers to go on this subcommittee. A notice is to be put in the Generator about this subcommittee meeting say following the next meeting. An agenda should be made for this meeting and we could refer to the list of old runs for ideas. Richard McKellar said we should also look for suggestions from new members. Mark Parritt said we should make the run reports more simple to encourage people to do them;
- 4. Trevor Sarbach is organising a Mystery Run for October which will finish at a pub.

Items for Sale / Tips & Hints:

Neil Cheney is after a stay that holds the boot open.

Wayne Cunningham is after a good bumper for a Morris Minor 1000.

Braidy has had a problem getting parts from the Charles Ware Centre in England. Mark Parritt advised to buy from ESM as he has found them to be superb. Richard McKellar advised that Braidy should actually talk to Zack Ware the son of Charles Ware for a quicker response.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 9.22pm followed by the drawing of the raffle.
