### FOR QUICK TURNAROUND OF APPLICATIONS AND RENEWALS

### PLEASE EMAIL AND SCAN DOCUMENTS WHERE POSSIBLE

It is the Club Member's responsibility to send renewals and applications in a timely manner.

### **New Permits (Morris Minor and non-Morris Minor Vehicles)**

You must be either a life member or financial (paid up) member for a period of 6 months + before you can apply for a new permit. An application fee of \$20 is required. Payment can be made via cash or cheque made out to the MMCCV to the MMCCV Secretary or a Committee member at MMCCV monthly meetings.

When applying for a permit for a:

**Morris Minor:** Email or mail a copy of the vehicles current RWC, proof of ownership and the following **(2) VicRoads forms** 1. Club Permit Application form. 2. Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration for Club Permit Scheme Vehicle form.

**Non-Morris Minor:** Applications must be accompanied by all the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor vehicle held in the name of the applicant.

All Morris Minor and Non-Morris Minor applications must include (6) recent photos showing images of: 1. Vehicle front. 2. Vehicle rear. 3. Vehicle driver's side. 4. Vehicle driving position (side on with driver's door open). 5. Chassis number or ID plate. 6. Vehicle engine bay. All mailed photos should be signed and dated on back. Electronic photos are authenticated by email date.

You **must** notify the CPS Officer (Geoff Shepherd) of your red plate permit number within 48 hours of VicRoads issue via email cpsregistrar@morrisminorvic.org.au and morrisminorclubplates@gmail.com or phone 0419 137 711. Failure to notify the CPS Officer of your club permit number can have serious consequences for the Club and may cause the Club's permit scheme to be suspended by VicRoads for failure to keep up to date records.

**Renewals:** Do not forget to sign your renewal application. If your application is not signed it will be returned to you. No photos are required for renewal applications.

Please email or, if mailing, send a stamped self-addressed envelope with VicRoads forms. It is your responsibility to renew on time. No renewal reminders will be issued to permit holders.

### **Rules Regarding Club CPS Responsibilities**

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist:

The member has ceased to be financial.

The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.

The vehicle is unroadworthy.

The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.

The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

### The New CPS Registrar first 100 Days



Feedback from Members using electronic copies and scanning renewals.

We have had one member who had an electronic copy of a signed renewal knocked back when they did an in person over the counter renewal.

It would appear that Vicroad's accepts electronic copies when renewing and up loading online, but knocked this one back when renewing over the counter. We have had many over the counter renewals with electronic copies with out any incident.

My advice as CPS Registrar is where possible renew online and use your my Vicroads account. They are very easy to set up and just require an email address and your Victorian Drivers Licence number. The process online is easy with payment via credit card, then the permit once signed by an authorised club member is uploaded. Once the renewal is uploaded and paid Vicroads then checks the office bearers signature and emails back with in 24 hours confirming the permit is renewed.

If you wish to renew via mail to me then please send a return stamped self addressed envelope, so I can return the signed renewal form, log book permit sticker and window label. Members are sending me cheque's made out to Vicroads and as such are not following instructions slowing down the renewal process. Please read the instructions in the newsletter.

#### Lateness of renewals

it is disappointing that some members are sending renewals to me after date of expiry or with a few days to go to expiry. The permit system is a privilege and not a right and the continual lateness shows disrespect to the Club and the Club permit system.

I do wish to thank all member's that have had their renewals in on time which makes the administration easier.

## GENERAL MEETING MINUTES OF THE MORRIS MINOR CAR CLUB OF VICTORIA INC.

### HELD AT THE HORRIE WATSON HALL, DEEPDENE AND ALSO VIA ZOOM ON

### THURSDAY 11 TH AUGUST 2022

The President welcomed the members present and online and opened the meeting at 8.01pm. Committee Members Present: President: Stewart Carr; Editor: Barb Went; Secretary: Ed James; Membership: Jim Gourlay; Regalia: Alan & Liam Todd; and Database Manager: John Druery. Attendance: Approximately 18 members were present together with 3 members via Zoom. Apologies: Geoff Shepherd, Trevor Dangerfield, Rob Spielman, Catriona Bruce, Mark Bosley, Cheryl Scicluna, Henry Edwards, Mark Perritt, Ann Druery and Anne Carr.

Visitors and New Members: Returning members Darren & Tracy (Membership No. 179) who are looking for another Morris Minor, and new member Leigh Wallace who has just purchased a white 1960 two door Morris Minor. Leigh also donated two Morris Minor manuals to be the club.

### **Acceptance of Minutes:**

Minutes of the previous meeting held 14 th July 2022 accepted on the motion of Ross Carr and seconded by Jim Gourlay.

**President's Report:** As per the Generator.

**Secretary's Report:** Various items of information have been received by email and forwarded to appropriate office bearers. Some enquiries received about the sale of Morris Minors and/or parts together with technical requests. These have been referred to appropriate persons.

**Treasurer's Report:** Katie absent but Stewart advised that we have a current operating balance of \$6,329.38. With our term deposit of \$8,512.07 we have a combined balance of our accounts of \$14,841.45.

**Membership Officer's Report:** As per the Generator. Jim advised that we have had a surge in people joining the club and we currently have 184 members including 7 Life members. We have 7 new members a number of whom are return members.

Club Captain's Report: While we no longer have a Club Captain, Braidy gave details of the run to Mount Macedon on 14 th August. Jim advised that Mark Parritt is organising the run to the McClelland Gallery on 25 th September, and the Morrykana is being held at the beginning of October at Roxburgh College. The Geelong club is organising their memorial car club run to Daylesford on Sunday 23 rd October which we have been invited to with other Morris Minor Clubs. We have decided to make this one of our runs, the details of which will be in the Generator. The November run on Melbourne Cup day possibly to Henrys is yet to be finalised. Christmas is at the Manningham Club. For next year we are looking for people to organise runs in February, March or April.

CPS Officer's Report: Geoff absent but he has passed on via Stewart that we presently have 101 cars on club plates. He said that so far he has processed 15 registration renewals since he took over at the beginning of May. Geoff is finding that many members are leaving it to the latest possible time after the registration has expired to submit their renewals and has asked if this could be improved.

**Regalia Officers:** Alan advised that several items are in the pipeline including the T shirts for the National Rally and various other items of new regalia including hats.

Editor's Report: Barb advised that the club is doing a calendar for next year featuring cars

photographed on runs. They should be available at the November meeting and will cost \$15.00. Any new members are asked to feel free to submit articles for publishing in the Generator.

**AOMC Report:** Stewart advised that the next AOMC meeting will be held in Seymour on 27 th August. He cannot attend but asked if any other members could do so on behalf of the club. Braidy volunteered her services to attend this meeting.

### **GENERAL BUSINESS:**

- 1. Stewart gave an update on the preparations for the National Rally. Details of dates, accommodation, etc. will be noted in the Generator;
- 2. Braidy advised of a 'Morrys on Tour' website that gave information on how to prepare your Morry for a long drive. A link will be put in the Generator;
- 3. We still have vacancies on the Committee for a Vice President, Club Captain, Historian and Librarian for anyone wanting to take on a role.

# The Time of Our Lives: by Alan Todd







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As many members will know, I have just returned from an overdue trip to England, primarily to visit ageing parents. A couple of weeks before leaving, I thought it might be nice to catch up with a local Morris Club, close to where I used to live and grew up. I come from the county of Essex, close to the beautiful market town of Saffron Walden, where I went to secondary school and where my mother now lives.

On contacting the Essex branch of the MMOC, they suggested, that as the county is quite spread out, that I contact the Uttlesford sub-branch. Upon contacting their President, Jonathon Morgan, he welcomed me to join them in their various activities throughout my stay. As it turned out, they are based in none other than the town of Saffron Walden!

Jonathon emailed me their calendar of events, the first being four days after my arrival at their bi-monthly meeting, at a lovely country pub 'The Plough' in the nearby village of Great Chesterford. Throughout the area, many homes date back to the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> century, with thatched cottages commonplace.

As I arrived in the carpark of The Plough on a beautiful summer's evening, there were seven or eight Morries parked already, looking very grand and well kept. On parking up I was given a friendly greeting by many members. Their meetings, as I've learnt, are very different to ours, in that it involves a pub meal and a few pints! It was very informal and quite a social occasion, with a great sense of friendship between everyone. I had some great conversations regarding anomalies between Australian built Morries and UK Morries, along with club events and the general Morris movement in the UK.

After finishing our meals and a pint of Guinness, we wandered over to the Morries, and I listened to the stories of where they came from, what family member had previously owned it, and works that had been done to keep them in good order. I got talking to Colin Carter and his wife Carol who have a 1954 Series 2 Convertible, a wonderful car. It was covered in Union Jack bunting and I was curious to know why. If any of you had watched the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations, you might have seen it there. In London, there had been many things organised, one of them, a pageant called 'The Time Of Our Lives', which was partly a procession of British-made cars from the 50's.

To be able to participate, Colin and Carol had to go through an application process with the MMOC and wait for many months before learning that they were successful. Two days before the parade, the car had to be taken to London and x-rayed to be checked for explosives before being kept in a secure compound until the parade took place. They learned that they were one of only 19 Morries to take part in the parade.

During the parade, they had around an hour driving around many well-known streets in London such as 'Horse Guards Parade', and down The Mall to Buckingham Palace, while waving, smiling and tooting to the crowd. Colin drove with Carol in the backseat, like royalty herself! After the parade, all participants were able to attend a live performance by Ed Sheeran in front of Buckingham Palace and an appearance by the Queen and other royal family members. Talking to me, I could tell it was such a highlight for them personally to be part of such a thing at their stage of life, from such a small club. They are very modest and after having met them, I can't think of anyone more deserving of the experience.

As our evening came to a close, Jonathon thanked me for being part of the evening and said some kind words. We have a pact to stay in touch. I will definitely make a point of catching up with them again next time I'm in that part of the world. I'm now on their email list to receive their newsletter, so if anyone would like to see it, please let me know.

### 1955 Grey Morris Minor project:



My wife WanTing has always loved Morris Minors since first seeing one driving around Croydon about 8 years ago, she thinks they are cute and loves their round shape. Back in June she saw a 1955 Morris Minor 4 door advertised on Facebook Marketplace not far away from us (we live in Croydon). She asked me to go and check it out, thinking it might be a good project for me once the house renovation is finished and our kids are a bit older. Off I went at about 8:30PM with my head torch and no prior knowledge of Morris Minors to have a look... in the dark. Checking it over it obviously had some rust but I figured a 67 year old car is going to have a bit of rust? Being a boilermaker in a previous life I wasn't too concerned about the idea of cutting and welding panel sections. The seller had stated in the listing that it required a front chassis rail repair section, which didn't seem to be a big issue. It came with a complete set of spare doors, bonnet and boot lid, I thought it was a good deal and put down a deposit. I picked it up the following week, when I got it home and had a good look over it in daylight, I realised I had bought her a real project car...


From what I can gather the car was originally sold in New South Wales; it has a small plate on the front left firewall that say 'supplied by Peter Lloyd Limited' with an ID number. It was last registered in Victoria in 1987 and had then made its way over to South Australia. When stripping the interior, I found a 28 day permit (from 2001) behind the glovebox for an address in a town called Kalangadoo. I googled the address of the house and street view showed it was an old house surrounded by walnut trees. When I removed the kick step plates, I found rodent chewed walnut shells inside sill/boxing channels, I also discovered a mouse nest in the headlining. The car has obviously had a bit of a 'dulux rebuild' at some point as the already rusted boxing channels had received a coat of paint. The gutter channel and the roof has rust near the left hand B-Pillar. This seems a bit unusual and my suspicion is the Morris may have sat outside underneath those walnuts trees for a long time where debris had accumulated in the gutter channel? It is otherwise pretty straight and all the deterioration seems to be the result of just sitting out in the weather?

It has rust in what I'm assuming are standard locations, sills, boxing channel, floorpan door hinge pillars, B pillars, C pillars, boot floor rear section, which all seem fixable with time and money. The only area that really concerns me is the roof /gutter channel rust near the B-pillar. I'd be interested to hear from members who have encountered rust in this area or who have any suggestions on how to repair it. I'm in the process of fabricating a rotisserie and hope to have the shell stripped out, braced and up on the rotisserie by next winter so I can start the repair work.


